McDonald's – Another View

In response to the letter from Aleta Harrison, I would like to voice other views.

I believe the letter misses the point completely. Surely it is not a question of where should they build a "restaurant" (which is what McDonald's wants), but do we want the Golden Arches to be the gateway to the North Norfolk coast?

A McDonald's would devastate the local economy. Food shops, burger bars, ice cream parlours and coffee shops would all be at risk of losing trade, as people would stop on the way into Hunstanton, and not buy goods and services within the town.

Will McDonald's source any products locally? Well, the answer is "No", as they would use existing supply chains. Local farmers and other producers in Norfolk would not see any benefit.

Opening 24/7 would generate more noise, pollution and an Uber delivery service would see an increase in traffic in all the surrounding area.

Traffic is another concern. At busy times, it is not unusual to see traffic queuing as far as Snettisham. Add to that, cars pulling in and out of a McDonald's is a recipe for accidents, further delays and frustration for people heading to our beautiful coast.

As for employment, young people will be expected to work 24/7 at some unsociable hours at a relatively low wage - and existing local shops and restaurants will find it harder to recruit staff.

Finally - health. Another fast-food restaurant would do nothing to help schools and parents to encourage healthy eating and reduce obesity.

I believe we need to think very seriously about the wider implications of a major fast-food chain on our already fragile local economy.

Heacham Junior School Heacham Pupils lap up Challenge

Pupils ran, cycled, walked, and jogged, when they took part in a sponsored event where they raised more than £500 for their school.

The 'Fieldathon' at Heacham Junior School, which is a member of the West Norfolk Academies Trust, saw around 90 children complete sponsored laps of the school field, with some joined by family members.

Assistant Headteacher, Ashley Kirwan, was impressed by the pupils' commitment and enthusiasm – as well as their support of one another. "The Fieldathon is an annual event here at Heacham Junior, where pupils are sponsored to walk, run, cycle, jog – however they wish – to complete laps of our school field," he said. "We had children participating from Years 3 to 6, although some younger siblings came along and joined in for some laps too, as did parents. We had some lovely acts of encouragement and kindness from pupils helping others in the heat. The sun certainly came out for us!"

The event was organised by the Friends of Heacham Junior School, with members of school staff on hand to keep track of the pupils' completed laps. Mr Kirwan continued: "We had our teachers James Agate, Megan Wells, Katie Cornwell, and teaching assistant Hariette Pateman, stamping children's cards in order to collect laps. Some children collected as many as 30 laps in just 40 minutes.



"We don't have an exact figure yet for money raised, but it is over £500, with the money going towards trips and experiences for the pupils." He added: "it was a highlight to see so many members of the community



coming to enjoy the day, with refreshments on offer too. The benefits of events like this go beyond those benefits for the children alone. It brings a sense of togetherness for the community, while allowing us to raise money for the Friends to help towards school trips, and special events and experiences for the children."

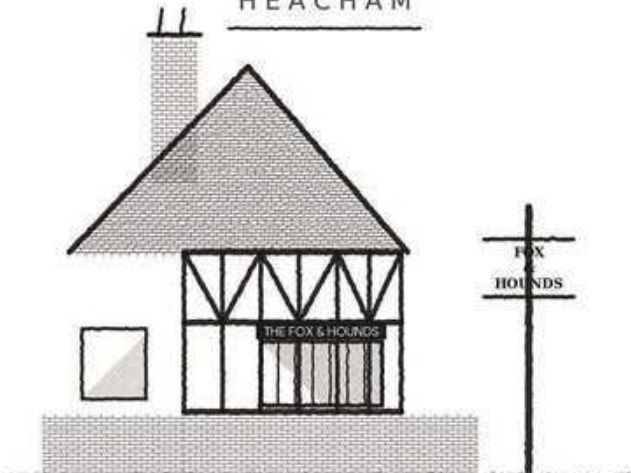

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN HEACHAM



Over the last few years our international news has been dominated by wars and rumours of wars, while various diseases, notably Covid and Ebola have afflicted populations. Famines, earthquakes and storms with their resultant landslides and tsunami have decimated the lives of many across our world. Most recently many areas of our world are experiencing heatwaves. Western Europe is not prepared for these temperatures and, as we swelter in our poorly insulated homes, surely nobody can deny the events of global warming seen and felt in climate change. What is happening to our world? How and when will it all end?

Those are exactly the questions a group of his disciples asked Jesus when, pointing to the massive, ornate structure of the temple in Jerusalem he declared, all this will be destroyed. Each of the gospel writers Matthew, Mark and Luke record this conversation. In reply Jesus said "When you hear of wars and uprisings do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away. There will be great earthquakes, famines and pestilences in various places and fearful events and great signs from heaven." Is this what we have been seeing internationally over recent months?

John, the fourth gospel writer, contributes to this picture in a different way. As an old man banished to the island of Patmos he was given a prophecy concerning how the world as we know it will end. This we have as the Book of Revelation. In addition to the wars, disease and weather phenomena this account describes extreme heat affecting the earth. Our recent heatwaves? Revelation describes a series of events which will happen at the end of our world as we know it.

Why did God want us to know what will occur? Would this enable us to address the climate crisis which scientists largely agree is driven by burning fossil fuels, deforestation and industrial emissions? Remember Jesus said "the end will not come right away" giving us a little time to respond to these warning signs.

Above all else, God loves the world he created and every person who lives in it. His invitation to turn to him promises everlasting life. That is why he sent his Son Jesus into the world to save every one of us who will accept him as our saviour.

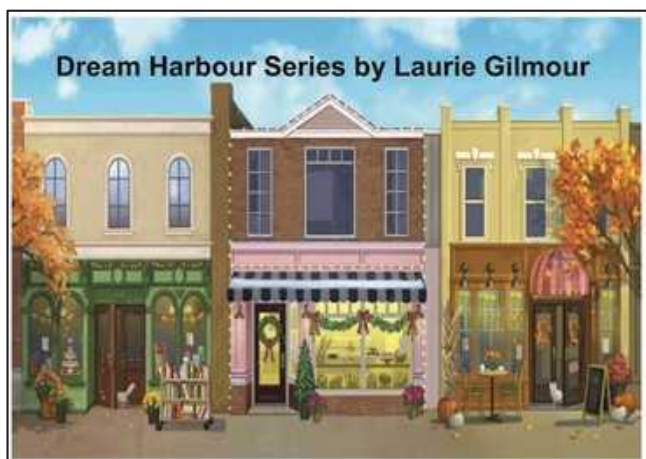

POSSIBLY URGENT

I made a mistake about the intentions of McDonalds. I was convinced that their proposed site, at the lavender lights' junction, was marketing hype so that their real intentions, to build further along the A149, beyond Lidl's, would seem a good idea. However, after meeting with a handful of their representatives, it is clear that their daft idea is real. They likely intended to submit a planning application for the lavender junction site before the end of July so it could be live now. If you have comments to make, get them on the planning portal asap. And look out for a public meeting. It's all a bit chicken and egg as any necessary arrangements can't be made until an application is put in and once it is done the time for response is limited. Though, having said that, it is normal for public comments to be accepted up until a few days before the application appears at planning committee. That might be several months down the line.

Most of the presentation was telling us how wonderful they are. Facts gleaned: The public consultation that McDonald's underwent had 1478 responses. 46% supported the proposal, including those with unspecified reservations (I guess location), which means 54% opposed the proposal outright. It is their intention to employ 'local' staff but they do have a travel plan for employees to reduce car journeys for those from further afield. Their traffic survey around the potential site was done in March before the tourist season began. Litter is only picked up within 150m of the site.

Borough Council by elections in Heacham and Snettisham have been thrust upon us due to the resignations of the incumbents.

It may surprise Heacham residents that you had two Borough Cllrs but two were elected three years ago. I am one of them and will remain as a Borough Cllr after this election.

Next May 2027, my four-year term is up and there may be elections for the two Borough Councillor posts or they will likely be extended for one year because, in May 2028, the plan is for the new West Norfolk Unitary authority to take over. To that end, next May 2027, there should be elections for the shadow unitary councillors. These have to shadow existing Borough and County Cllrs for one year. My intention is to stand so, if elected, I can shadow myself.

There is a fly in the ointment called the Reform group at County who are challenging the move to unitary. The expectation is that the challenge will fail. I maintain that the best opportunity for local representation on all matters dealt with both by Borough and County is the three unitary model that has been accepted by government. Our unitary will be called West Norfolk and will include Breckland and a portion of South Norfolk.

The Borough Council's proposed sale of the land the beach huts sit on at North Beach caused some furore last year. In the end, it wasn't sold and new financial arrangements saved the hut owners some money. At a recent meeting with the portfolio holder, I was surprised to be offered the land as a gift to Heacham Parish Council if they were prepared to take it on. This is in the very early stages of negotiation as all the paperwork has yet to be seen. It would guarantee that the land would not be sold whatever council rules in the future and should provide an income, not a large one, to the Parish.

Another piece of Borough Council land has rattled cages recently. This is the piece of greenery just off the High Street accessed from a track close to its junction with Lynn Road. A

former bowling green and, before that, the garden to a pub long gone. Property services put it up for sale with prior approval for two houses. An interested party enquired and was told they could build 4 houses. I took umbrage at this and enquired of someone with sense how it jumped from 2 to 4. I also asked the Borough expert on Neighbourhood plans what the status of a designated green space, in a plan, was should it be sold. The upshot is, that green space cannot be developed and any owner can only do work to enhance its green features. In consequence, the Borough now appears willing to give it to the Parish Council together with a pointer to grants which will enable appropriate work to be done. Again, this is in very early stages and discussions have to be held.

The government has caused a new, Borough wide, Local Plan to be developed. A notice of intention was published on the 30th June and it will have to be adopted in May 2029. During September there will be what is called a Scoping Consultation which is meant to inform planners what people think should be included within the Plan and how they would like to be engaged and kept up to date with its progress. Details will be online and in the press. Local meetings for the public will also be arranged. Our nearest is likely to be in Hunstanton. Parish Councils will be provided with all details. At the same time, details of the call for sites will be released. This is all of the 750 sites that land owners, across the Borough, have, so far, offered for development. There will be an opportunity to comment on them. I have not seen the list yet but there will be sites in Heacham and in Sedgeford. There will be an interactive map showing all sites.

It is very important that everyone takes an interest in the development of this Local Plan and the sites that could come forward for development as, together, they will influence your

lives, and those of your children and grandchildren. Look out for details, come September ask the Parish Council, and I will give further information as soon as it becomes available to me.

The fields off Cheney Hill, have been and may still be, Heacham's wild flower meadow. Soil disturbance and the sun have brought out a wealth of species of many colours either flowering within the tall grasses or as separate blocks. Many species of butterflies are feeding there while swifts have soared overhead and barn owls hunt in the early evening, Skylarks added their song to that of their lower flying brethren, the finches and tits. The odd rabbit and deer are seen moving between the swaying grasses and along hedgerows. 134 houses are due to be built on two thirds of the land. Progress.

The public consultation on the principle of King's Lynn having a Town Council resulted in 86% in favour. The Electoral Arrangements Committee recommended that the second consultation, which will contain more detail, is now prepared. Full Council will have the final decision. I have always been in favour of a Town Council for Lynn and put it into the Corporate Plan 3 years ago. Local Government Reorganisation has given the process impetus.

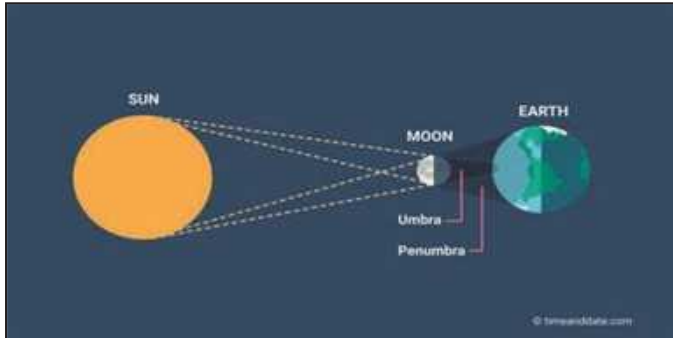

Heacham at Night

by Terry Parish

Two eclipses for the price of one this month. Both are partial but welcome phenomenon that are easy to observe given clear skies or, at least, some breaks in the clouds.

The first, a partial solar eclipse, is on the 12th August. It occurs low in the WNW just before Sunset. Start time is 6.15pm; maximum (91%) coverage of the Sun by the Moon is 7.11pm, and it ends at 8.04pm.



Solar eclipse. We will just enter the edge of the umbra so will have a partial eclipse.

A website, Time and Date, provides full information of times, what to expect and why it happens and it has pages for different locations including King's Lynn and West Norfolk District. Just Google and use AI to find it.

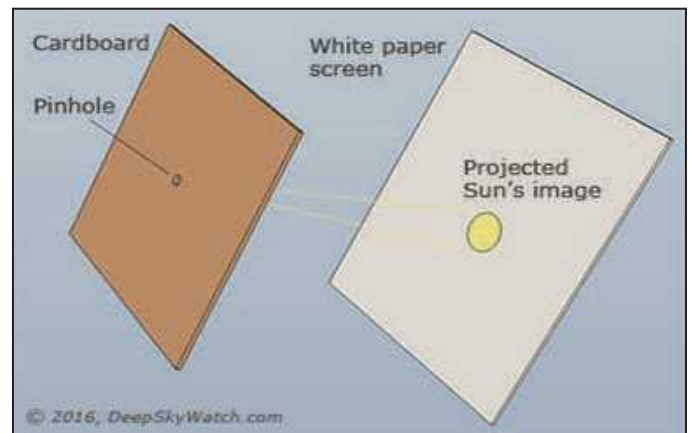
Like many of you, my view is likely to be at least partially blocked by trees or buildings. Look out a better position before the 12th. I think I will go up to the Heacham Chalk Pit.



Heacham March 20th 2015. Solar partial eclipse underway. At maximum, it too had around 90% of the Sun eclipsed by the Moon. Parish

It is advised that you do not try and look directly at the Sun and you certainly must not use standard optical instruments. Last month I recommended getting eclipse glasses and you should still be able to order some online up to a few days before the event. In the old days, welders' glasses or several layers of black and white film negatives were recommended. Best of luck getting hold of them.

I have eclipse glasses, eclipse binoculars, and devices to fit on either end of a telescope but you don't need any of them if you are prepared to watch the eclipse by projection:



Using foil where the pinhole is made creates a sharper image.

The simplest way is to use two pieces of white card. Cut a rectangular hole, say 3cm square, in the centre of one. Tape a piece of aluminium cooking foil over the hole but don't let the tape go over the centre. Use a pin to make a small hole in the centre of the foil. Use by putting your back to the Sun. Hold the cards apart, the one with the pinhole towards the Sun. Adjust the distance to see an image of the Sun on the plain white card.

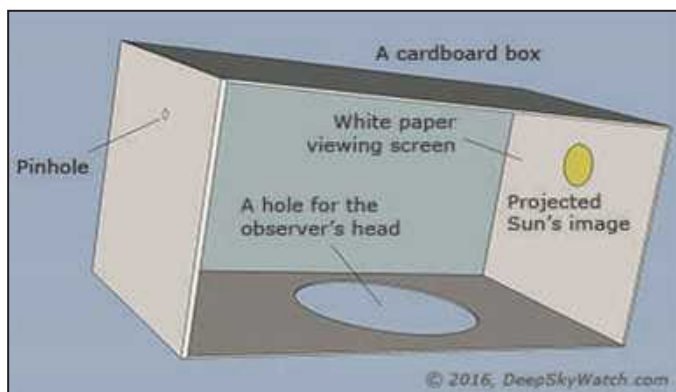

You can be more sophisticated and make your two cards opposite ends of a box (shoe box sized or so). Cut out a third to half of the bottom of the box. With your back to the Sun, hold the box just above your head, pinhole towards the Sun, look at the 'screen' through the hole in the bottom of the box.

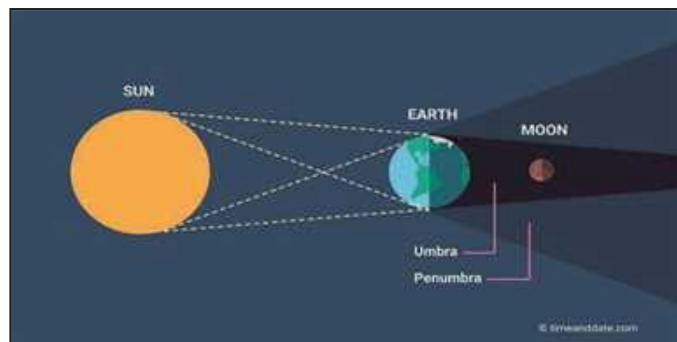


You don't have to make it big enough for your head but it might be fun.

Or you can just use a colander. Hold it in front of a white card and move it about. You will see multiple images of the eclipse. More ideas online.

If you want to be scientific, note the time, to the second, when the eclipse starts and ends. Estimate when maximum coverage occurs and time that too. Take note of anything strange that happens in the natural world. I don't think there will be much as it is not a total eclipse which fools birds and insects, but you never know until you look.

On the 28th there is a partial eclipse of the Moon, 93% covered by the Earth's shadow. You will have to be a little keen to observe this as it happens in the early hours.



The Moon enters the Earth's penumbra, half shadow, at 2.23am and the umbra, full shadow, at 3.33am. The maximum eclipse is at 5.12am and the Moon should appear reddish orange. The Moon sets at 6.15am before the eclipse has finished.

The Moon will be very low on the horizon and you will need to get down to Heacham beaches to see the eclipse. I might meet you there. Those of you in Hunstanton, head for the cliffs or promenade.

The red colour is due to Earth's atmosphere which scatters blue light but allows red light, of longer wavelength, to pass through whilst bending, refracting it, and illuminating the Moon. If we didn't have an atmosphere then the Moon, where eclipsed, would become completely black but we wouldn't be here to see it.

Not content with two eclipses, the month has the Perseid meteor shower, the best chance you have of seeing many meteors. The shower occurs over several weeks but the peak is on the night of the 12th/13th. Look from darkness on the 12th, say 9pm, and stay up as late as you can. Accustom your eyes to the dark for 15mins and don't spoil that acquired sensitivity by popping into a lit-up house. Red goggles are useful but I may have the only set in Heacham. Look vaguely north but meteor trails can appear in any direction. The Moon is well out of the way busy eclipsing the Sun. If there are patchy clouds look between the gaps.

There are 3 planets worth looking out for. Venus is still shining bright and gets brighter as the month progresses when it will have a magnitude of minus 4.6. Its phase is a little more than half. However it is low in the western sky and competes with the post sunset afterglow. The planet sets by 9.30pm and you will need a clear western horizon. On the 15th, Venus is at its greatest eastern elongation, easterly distance, from the Sun which will aid observation. It is also close to the Moon but, as this lies below Venus, it may have set before you can see both bodies together.

Saturn, the ringed planet, is a night object again and emerges in the east, at the beginning of the month, at about 11pm. However, it won't be high enough to observe easily until around 1am, With a magnitude of +0.6, a reasonable eye will see it once you know where you are looking. Steady binoculars will be useful but, if you want to see the rings, some kind of telescope will be needed. As the month progresses, Saturn moves higher and inches towards the south; it will be high enough for observations by 10.30pm by the 30th. The Moon is just above it on the 4th and 30th.

Mars appears in the ENE from 3am early in the month, dimmer than Saturn with a magnitude of +1.2. The Moon is above it on the 9th. By the end of the month, it will have moved a tad further towards the east and be high enough for observation by 2.30am. If you stay up for the eclipse of the Moon and/or Perseid watching take the opportunity to find Mars.

I hope you at least see the partial eclipse of the Sun. If you want see it in totality then go to northern Spain or western Iceland but it will not be overhead. And catch, not literally, a few Perseids.

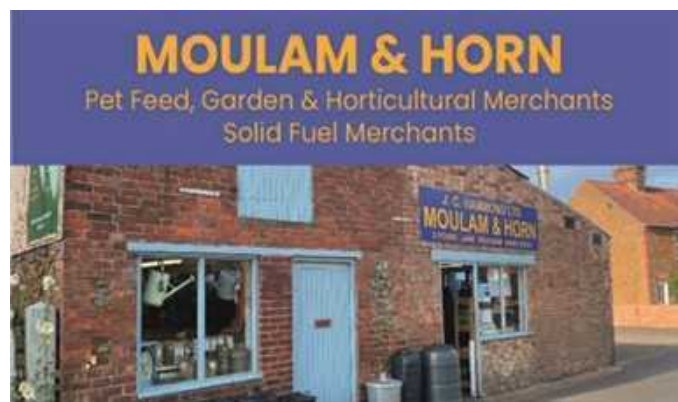
Summer Photography Exhibition

SHARP - Discovering the past

Have you heard of SHARP, Sedgeford Historical and Archaeological Research Project? I'd seen signs for the Dig whilst driving through Sedgeford but I was invited on behalf of the Newsletter to attend the opening of their newly refurbished visitor centre before the 4 weeks of this year's Dig starts, and we learned some interesting facts about the project.



There has been an archaeological dig at Sedgeford since 1996, so this is their 30th anniversary year of excavations and everyone is excited about what will be discovered this year.

Although the Anglo Saxon cemetery, later the settlement site and now the malting complex, have been major areas of focus there have been many smaller projects in the parish that have produced finds from prehistory to modern day. Crouched burials, so called as the individual is laid to rest on their side in a sleeping position, date back as far as the Bronze Age, and a selection of worked flint tools also reflects life in Sedgeford during the prehistoric era. But the team at SHARP have also recovered artefacts from the Roman times, Mediaeval times and later.



The visitor centre now has a large collection of items found over the years all catalogued and numbered and set out in beautifully made cabinets and drawers for everyone to see (including a pull out step for children to view top drawer contents), and there's also an interactive display for children.



The open month is for research archaeology giving people time and the opportunity to discover a broad picture of the area but also brings people together whether they are students, retired lecturers, or just someone who wants to try something different for a day.

Dr Ellie Blakelock has been Director of Excavations since 2022. She has been attending the Dig for over 20 years and has written a book celebrating the 30 year project. The book is available to buy at the centre. She has seen some amazing finds over the years and still has great enthusiasm and excitement for the ongoing research.



Ann Smith, who lives in Heacham, joined the project in 2000 and is now the Finds Co-ordinator and her dream has come true of a mini museum that displays hundreds of historical artefacts from the parish of Sedgeford due to some generous funding last year. The cabinets were made by Richard Northcott who travels from Yorkshire to take part in the Dig after becoming interested in history during lockdown, and he was helped by Alvin who described himself as "general dogsbody" so a very valued team member!



This year, the Dig started on July 12th and is open until Friday August 7th, 10am - 4pm (Closed on Saturdays), so please pay them a visit and you'll find out more about this amazing and long term project.

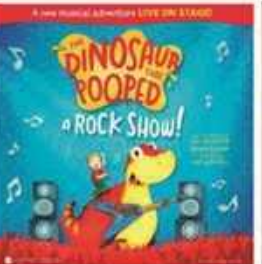

THE SMALL COMPANY TAX SHAKE-UP: WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW?

As Government spending rises and HMRC constantly try to find more tax revenues, closing the perceived “tax gap” is a perennial concern. One area which has particularly attracted attention is the small company sector. According to a report published on 19 March “The predominant risks contributing to the tax gap in the small company population are:

- under-reported income and over-claimed expenses
- error and evasion in transactions that occur between a company and its owners.”

HMRC expects to make progress in both these areas but are initially looking to implement procedures to focus on the level of shortfall in order to be able to crack down on the amounts of tax apparently lost.

The consultation, which ran from 19 March to 10 June, covers both private companies and their shareholders/ directors (in HMRC terms “close companies and their participators”) looking at:

- mandatory reporting to HMRC of transactions between close companies and their participators
- the scope of the transactions to be included.
- the specific requirements as to what will need to be reported, including the format and timing.

The intention appears to be a requirement for close companies to provide detailed information of internal transactions including:

- sales and purchases of assets to or from the company
- dividends or other distributions
- any other transfer of value from the company to the participator.

The consultation does not make it clear how frequently such reports will be required, the options presumably being a single report as part of the annual corporation tax return or more regular reports along the lines of the quarterly “making tax digital” legislation.

One aspect which is likely to come under scrutiny is the tendency for some company directors to withdraw funds as required over of the financial year, with the accountants sorting the tax aspects after the year end. This normally involves the payment of a dividend between the year end and the filing of the accounts to

cover both the amounts withdrawn and the notional interest on the balance – more regular reporting would presumably accelerate the payment of the dividends and possibly move the personal tax liability into an earlier year.

There is also a danger that, if such dividends have not been properly evidenced, there is an argument that the payments which have been charged to the loan account are not loans at all and that PAYE and NIC should have been charged at the time the payments are made.

However, irrespective of what the consultation might conclude, it is clear that HMRC are already pressing ahead with the factfinding. The 2025/26 tax return pages for SA102 directors and employees now include a requirement to disclose:

- Whether they are a director of a close company
- The identity of the company
- The amount of dividends received
- The proportion of shares held.

Clearly the intention is for HMRC to link dividend income to specific companies and to identify discrepancies between personal tax returns and company results

The consultation concludes that “The government expects to explore other ways in which to address the small business CT gap in future.”

Aside from the point that HMRC have begun the collection of data before even publishing the “consultation” (which might lead the cynical to question the value of even making a response), it is worth considering which genuine business activities might be likely to fall within the terms of the proposed rules:

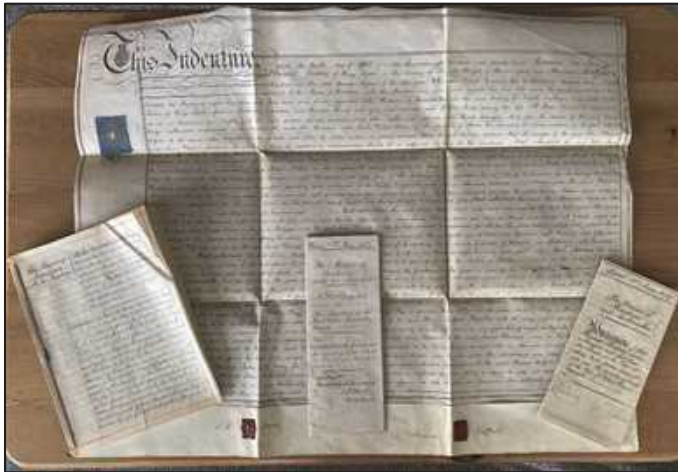

GOOD DEEDS FOR THE DAY

Quite recently, diggers moved on to the Malthouse Farm fields off Cheney Hill; they did not herald the culmination of the historical saga of planning for a housing development but marked a stage towards it. It is common now for archaeologists to investigate a site before it is covered with a large development of 'dwellings and associated infrastructure' to see if there is evidence of anyone living there before. As activity has ceased, it can be assumed that neither Roman amphitheatre nor Boudicca's chariot were discovered. Maybe a horseshoe or the broken stem of a farm labourer's clay pipe saw the light of day for the first time in many years as it seems likely that the land was farmed for centuries.

Richard Dix of Rural Broadband at Marea Farm kindly lent me a bundle of old documents relating to plots of land. They are of an age when solicitors' clerks still wrote in faultless longhand on vellum without the assistance of 'cut and paste' to repeat the wordy phrases concerning 'messuages, hereditaments and appurtenances.' Their one consolation was that they did not need to concern themselves overmuch with punctuation – a strange tradition (to a one-time English teacher) continued today. I will add some to what follows – but you might still need to take a deep breath to follow the trail!



1. *Original documents relating to plots of land, Marea Farm*

The name Thomas Duffield appears on four of the documents which provide some links not only to the time when he lived in the village but also to earlier times. He was born in 1823/4 and was a farmer of a modest area of land and also a butcher at one time. In 1861 he was a 'carrier' between Heacham and King's

Lynn before Evri was a twinkle/tear in anybody's eye. In 1879 an 'Admission' document prepared by the Deputy Steward of the Manor, records the legal process of Thomas being admitted to the Manor Roll with the purchase of a piece of 'copyhold' land. Although Heacham had a Manor it was the le Stranges' of Old Hunstanton who were Lords of the Manor. 'Copyhold' land remained the legal property of the Lord of the Manor with the copyholder having the right to occupy it.

Thomas Duffield purchased the land at auction for £160. The Admission document provides details of how the land came to be auctioned. The 1847 Will of Robert Browne, a Heacham tailor, left property and land to one Susan Large for her lifetime, after which his executors were to sell it. The bequest included property with ‘common rights’. Even after the enclosure of land in 1781 there remained large areas of common land; certain properties had ‘common rights’ which allowed occupiers rights such as grazing livestock and gathering firewood. In 1854 this land was also partitioned by the Inclosure (the spelling of the time) Commissioners, a plan prepared and numbered plots allotted to named villagers. Susan Large’s allotment was numbered 10 and when she died in 1878 it was auctioned by the heir of her executor. A ‘Bargain and Sale Indenture’ document complete with wax seals provides the legal confirmation of sale of 3 acres, two roods and fifteen perches of land to Thomas Duffield for £160. (Google advises me that is equal to 1.4872 hectares!)

A 'Conditional Surrender' document of 1887 also involves Thomas Duffield and opens up another avenue of Heacham history. It involves the Heacham Friendly Society which I believe existed until 1978 having been formed in 1837 and originally limited to forty-one members who were mechanics, tradesmen and farmers. In common with similar societies, members paid a monthly amount which was invested – often in local land and property for which rent could be collected and paid out to members as sick pay, for instance, in an age where an inability to work often led to the workhouse at Docking. This legal document between Thomas and the trustees of the Friendly Society sets out the agreement whereby he secured the sum of £150 with him paying interest annually with the acknowledgement that, should he or his heirs fail to pay, the trustees would take the copyhold land and property to dispose of by auction or private contract.

The fourth document linked to Thomas Duffield concerns his land after his death in 1905 at the age of eighty-two. It is a record of the meeting of the General Court Baron presided over by the Deputy Steward. The Court Baron was a historical

throwback to medieval times, being a civil court that dealt with customs of the Manor and matters concerning the tenants, presided over by a Steward. With the knowledge of Thomas Duffield's passing a 'proclamation' had been made for any heirs or successors to attend the Court to arrange for the interest to be paid. As none had appeared, three trustees of the Heacham Friendly Society appeared to claim Allotment number 10 as agreed in the Surrender document of 1887. They were successful.

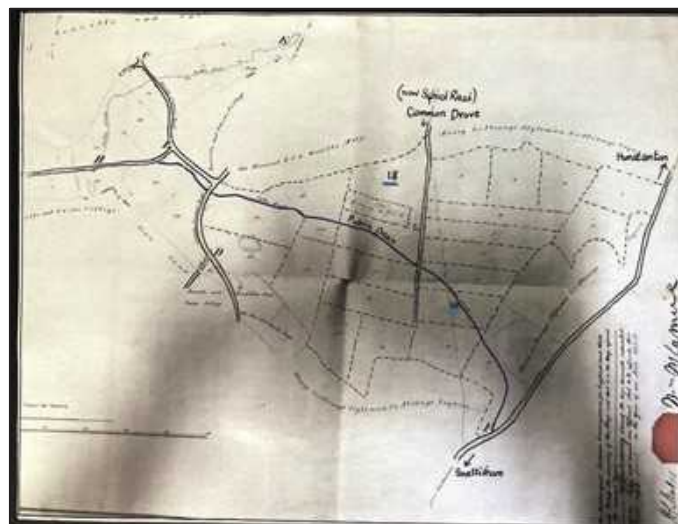
Thomas Duffield and his wife Ann had had no children to take on the land. He was described as a 'retired 'farmer' in the census of 1901 when he and his wife were living near the old chapel. Thomas Duffield was buried on 18 March at St Mary's . . . His wife Ann was buried the following day.

The only land I own is in front and behind a very unremarkable, 'modest' house with no carrstone, Tudor beams or Regency doorways and one that had no previous occupants but I was inspired to have a look through the deeds to it. They show that the land on which it stands, like Thomas Duffield's, was once owned by the le Strange family. In 1920 when Charles le Strange sold off parts of the family estate, this patch in Heacham was included and the new owner was William Woodbine, farmer and carter of Collins Farm in Collins Lane and when he died in 1942 it became the property of his son-in-law. After he died, the paperwork with all the legal i's dotted and t's crossed demonstrate transference between the hands of various developers before David Crown built the house. Interestingly – or not, as the case might be – one of the two men named in the Will of William Woodbine's son-in-law to whom probate was awarded, was the son of one of the trustees of

Heacham Friendly Society who claimed Thomas Duffield's land . . . and his son is currently a trustee of Heacham Youth and Community Trust.

Only guesswork will answer the question of whose land it was long before the le Strange family owned it but my house is just 50 metres (about 10 perches) from where Saxon skeletons were discovered on two properties within fifty metres of the house and about 100 metres from Marea Farm.
